

# Innovator Agent Update for IHN CCO Regional Community Advisory Council (July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2018)

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- Oregon's Coordinated Care Organizations certifications are set to expire between August 2018 and April 2019, depending on their original date of certification. In order to preserve continuity of care for OHP members, OHA is working to align CCO certification with the timeline of their service contracts. All CCOs will be recertified effective August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018 through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Bridging these contracts will allow CCOs to continue current operations during the application process for CCO 2.0.
- Oregon's Health Policy Board and OHA Director Pat Allen have completed a 2,000 mile Road Show around the state to gather input on CCO 2.0. One Road Show event was held in Corvallis on Tuesday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. The Oregon Health Policy Board will hear about the feedback provided during the Road Show at their next meeting on Tuesday, July 10<sup>th</sup>. - Oregon's Medicaid Advisory Committee (MAC) is seeking new members, with applications due on **August 15<sup>th</sup>**. The MAC advises the Oregon Health Policy Board and OHA and DHS leadership on the operations of Oregon's Medicaid program. MAC members are appointed by the Governor and must commit to attending regular meetings in Salem. The committee is seeking new members in the following areas:
  - a) Individuals from all parts of the state and from diverse backgrounds, including people of color, LGBTA, women and people with disabilities.
  - b) Individuals on OHP, including one OHP member with a disability
  - c) Members of health care consumer groups that include Medicaid recipients, including from CCO CACs.
  - d) A member from one of Oregon's federally recognized tribes
  - e) Persons associated with health care organizations, including providers (especially behavioral health and traditional health workers)
  - f) Members of the general public
