

# Innovator Agent Update for IHN CCO Regional Community Advisory Council (March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2018)

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- OHA Director Pat Allen has now been in his current leadership position for six months. He continues to analyze the current OHA structure for opportunities to improve and align the organization and staff for effectiveness. Dawn Jagger was recently named as the OHA Chief of Staff, having previously served as Interim External Affairs Director. IHN CCO will host a visit with Pat and Dawn on Tuesday, March 13<sup>th</sup> as a part of OHA's leadership's effort to visit each CCO.

- Oregon's Health Policy Board shared the process for CCO 2.0 at their meeting on Tuesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>. OHA and the OHPB will begin a series of public meetings that are expected to last through the summer for public input. CCO 2.0 will focus on four key areas identified by Governor Kate Brown. Those areas are:

Maintain sustainable cost growth  
Increase value and pay for performance  
Focus on social determinants of health and equity  
Improve the behavioral health system.

- CCOs are preparing to submit both their 2017 Transformation Plan Final Benchmark Report and their 2018 Transformation and Quality Strategy Plan (TQS) to OHA to meet contract requirements by this Friday, March 16<sup>th</sup>. The TQS combines the previous Transformation Plan and the Quality Plan that CCOs previously submitted. - The Office of Health Policy and OHA’s Data and Analytics team have released the “2017 Mid-Year Deeper Dive Report” which covers CCO performance on Quality Pool Metrics from July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 through June 30<sup>th</sup> 2017. - The Early Learning Division has released the 2017-2018 preliminary kindergarten assessment results that show correlation with 3<sup>rd</sup> grade skills. This year, for the first time, there is a group of students who have taken both the kindergarten assessment and the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade assessment. Although there is only one year of data, the results confirm that if we can support children to be ready for success when they enter kindergarten, they are more likely to be on track in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. - Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) released a phase 1 outreach summary report from statewide outreach meetings conducted from September-December 2017. - 2012-2017 Waiver evaluation: An independent evaluation of Oregon’s Medicaid waiver concluded that CCOs came up with innovative ways of providing care and slowed health care spending during the waiver period. The evaluation was conducted by OHSU’s Center for Health Systems Effectiveness, and also provides recommendations for continuing Medicaid transformation in Oregon. - Reporting OHP coverage on 2017 tax returns: 2017 is the first tax year that OHP members are required to report OHP coverage on their income tax return. People who file a 2017 federal income tax return, and who had OHP coverage in 2017, must identify the months of the year they had OHP. This information is in the IRS form 1095-B. - The “Cover all Kids” program began on January 1, 2018. CCOs began enrolling this population on March 1, 2018. This program is based on Senate Bill 558 that was passed in the 2017 legislative session, and the outreach communications are under “OHP now Covers Me.” More information is available at [www.ohpnowcoversme.org](http://www.ohpnowcoversme.org).
